On 14 November 2023, HealthBus Trust was awarded The King's Award for Voluntary Service (KAVS) 2023. This is the highest award a local voluntary group can receive in the UK and is equivalent to an MBE.

HealthBus Trust is one of 262 charities, social enterprises and voluntary groups to receive the prestigious award in 2023. Our work, along with others from across the UK, reminds us of all the ways fantastic volunteers are contributing to their local communities and working to make life better for those around them. It was created in 2002 to celebrate Queen Elizabeth II's Golden Jubilee and, following his accession, His Majesty The King emphasised his desire to continue the Award.

PatientSource allows the HealthBus team to record and manage patient information in an accessible, safe, and secure manner. The PatientSource cloud-based system has transformed the operational delivery of how patient information is utilised by the HealthBus clinical team.

It's estimated that more than 130,800 people who are eligible for the Covid booster vaccination on offer in Dorset this winter still haven't taken it. The HealthBus is partnering with health agencies and accommodation services to ensure that vulnerable patients have access to the vaccination. Together with Dorset Healthcare and YMCA, the HealthBus Clinical team are aiding with the vaccination delivery through drop-in clinics.

















HealthBus Trust launches new Electric Response Vehicle for Specialist Homeless Outreach

Over the past 12 months, the team has seen an increase in people needing help and support and the addition of a new car will help the team be more agile, visible, and importantly, see more patients.

For 9 months, Deano Pickering, (Head of Fundraising & Marketing) for the Trust has spent time raising the profile of the HealthBus and has been bowled over by the incredible response to support this project. Together partnering with grant-giving organisations and businesses the vision of having a bespoke urban vehicle dedicated to specialist homeless outreach is now a reality!

The new car was officially launched by the Lord Lieutenant of Dorset, Angus Campbell at JP Morgan on 06 December 2023 alongside distinguished guests and homeless agencies. The HealthBus Trust Trustees and Team are immensely grateful to those who support the charity and have dedicated their time, finances and commitment to enable patient-centred healthcare for people experiencing homelessness.
